3. JACOB CURTIS, DIED May 13, 1826, Aged 52  
 Great God how infinite are thou!  
 What worthless worms are we  
 Let the whole race of creatures bow  
 And pay their praise to thee.  
 Erected by Charles Day,  
 who married Eliza, daughter  
 of the deceased, in 1838.
4. ABIGAIL wife of Jacob Curtis, DIED Aug. 1, 1814, Aged 43  
 Death cannot make our souls afraid  
 If God be with us there:  
 We may walk through the darkest shade,  
 Only never yield to fear.  
 Erected by Charles Day  
 who married Eliza, daughter  
 of the deceased, in 1838.
5. ESTHER, WIFE OF Jacob Curtis, DIED Dec. 15, 1837, AE. 46 ys. 6 ms.  
 Our Mother here lies under the ground,  
 The dearest friend we ever found,

6. JOSHUA CURTIS. DIED Oct. 2, 1831, AE. 24 ys. 5 m.

2. MARY CURTIS. DIED Oct. 25, 1826, AE. 22 ys. 4 mos  
 Farewell O sister, dear farewell  
 Thoust left me lonely in this world of pain:  
 O may we meet in heavenly bliss,  
 At Gods right hand no more to part again.
3. ABIGAIL CURTIS. DIED Mar. 15, 1820, AE. 21 ys. 6 m.  
 Behold all you who pass me by,  
 As you are now so once was I,  
 As I am now you soon must be,  
 So be prepared to follow me.

4. HANNAH dau. of Jacob & Abigail Curtis, DIED May 4, 1818, AE. 15 ys. 9 m.  
Our sisters left this world of woe  
For regions of eternal love  
Twas God who called her from below  
To join in praising him above.
5. JACOB. son of Jacob & Esther Curtis, DIED Sept. 20, 1827, AE. 7 yrs. 7 m.

The stones were first documented in the spring of 1993. Many had fallen or been moved. The general order of the stones as they were found is as follows:

Row 1

1. Jane and Seth Storer
2. Father
2. Mother

- 2 J.S.S.

Row 3

1. Taylor
2. Alfred
3. Esther (Jacob's wife)
4. Abigail (Jacob's wife)
5. Joshua Curtis

Row 4

1. Mehitable Curtis
2. Mary Curtis
3. Abigail Curtis
4. Hannah (dau of Jacob & Abigail)
5. Jacob (son of Jacob & Esther)

Jacob Curtis (husband of Abigail and Esther) was found by itself, speculated he belonged in Row 3. For the restoration some stones were erected where found and others were placed according to logic. In other words, it is unknown if the stones match the graves. The fancy wrought iron fence and most of the granite foundation for the fence disappeared in 1995 or 1996 (discovered missing in October 1996).
